What is Family Medicine?


A medical specialty trained to treat most ailments and provide comprehensive health care for people of all ages— from newborns to seniors






Specialty can care for you your whole life

- Considering the impact of health on a patient's family



Who Are Primary Care Physicians?




More Than Half of All Office Visits in the US are to a Primary Care Physician





Primary Care, Underserved Areas


The areas in blue represent all the parts of the country where there are >3,000 people to 1 primary care physician





Primary Care Underserved Areas, No Internists


The areas in yellow represent all the new parts of the country where there would be >3,000people to 1 primary care physician if internists left

The areas in yellow represent all the new parts of the country where there would be >3,000 people to 1 primary care physician without Family Medicine


















