
Early Aspirations

Residency

- 3 years of training
- Involves a mix of clinical and educational responsibilities aimed at developing the skills necessary to provide comprehensive care for infants, children, and adolescents
 - A chief year may also add administrative responsibilities. Looks great on a CV!
- Rotations across numerous subspecialties such as neonatology, cardiology, hematology, adolescent medicine, developmental pediatrics, pediatric emergency medicine <3, etc..

Fellowship

- After completing 3 years of residency, additional 3 years of fellowship
 - Those who are emergency medicine trained residents may only be required 2 years of fellowship
- Focuses on the acute management of critically ill or injured children
 - Evaluate and treat a broad spectrum of acute pediatric conditions, including trauma, infections, toxicological emergencies, seizures, respiratory distress, cardiac arrest, etc
- Build procedural skills such as intubations, sedations, laceration repairs, chest tube placement, etc..

Fellowship

- Hybrid role between a learner and a teacher
 - Teaching fellow
 - Precepting residents
 - Weekly didactics
 - Simulation center
